CULTURAL PROGRAMME

Thursday, 27th of April 2006

9.00-12.00 Guided Tour to Historical Dubrovnik for conference attendants and accompanying persons

Half day excursion with entrances, including coach and tour guide.

You will be shown the most interesting sites of Dubrovnik, whose centre belongs to the World Heritage sites of the UNESCO. Dubrovnik, certainly one of the most beautiful cities of Europe, surrounded by city walls and fortifications lies on the foot of a mountain that slopes to the sea. An essentially medieval city reshaped by Baroque town planners after a disastrous earthquake of 1667, Dubrovnik's historic core seems to have been suspended in time ever since. Set-piece churches and public buildings blend seamlessly with the green-shuttered stone houses to form a perfect ensemble untouched by the 20th century. You will be impressed by the Rector's Palace (Knezev dvor) and the Europe's oldest apothecary in the Franciscan Monastery.

Saturday, 29th of April 2006

Bus travel and visit to the bays of Kotor, in neighbouring Montenegro.

All day excursion with lunch and entrances, including coach and tour guide. Journey to Montenegro with stop at the estuary of Kotor. During your trip you will pass the villages Risan and Perast, until you reach the historic city of Kotor

After lunch drive on via a winding route to Cetinje, the former capital of Montenegro, where you visit the local museum. Afterwards visit to Budva, here you have time to explore the city yourself. Travel back with coach and ferry.
