Objective:

- Equal access to and participation in quality higher education
- Widened access to and participation in quality higher education (in input, in the higher education process and in output through ensuring good retention and graduate rates)

Strategies:

The participating countries should establish national policies for

- the role of lifelong learning within higher education
- access to higher education for underrepresented groups (gender, ethnicity, socio-economic background, disabled, geography, (age))
- cooperation between higher education and lower educational levels
- student participation in higher education governance

Actions and tools to be in place in the participating countries:
